Bank of China (Hong Kong) Becomes Lead Partner of Hong Kong, China Tennis Association and Returns as Title Sponsor of ATP 250 Men's Professional Tennis Tournament

Tickets on Sale from 20 November

(18 November 2024, HONG KONG) The Hong Kong, China Tennis Association ("HKCTA") announced today that the Bank of China Hong Kong Tennis Open ("BOCHKTO") 2025 is set to take place from 29 December 2024 to 5 January 2025 at the Victoria Park Tennis Stadium. Ticket sales will begin on 20 November.
