## Bank of China (Hong Kong) becomes the title sponsor of Hong Kong Science Museum's new exhibition to showcase our country's sports achievements and sports science

This exhibition aims to showcase our country's remarkable sports achievements, demonstrate how innovative technologies assist athletes to scale new heights, and encourage the public to develop a healthy and active lifestyle.

Mr Stephen Chan, Deputy Chief Executive of Bank of China (Hong Kong), said that BOCHK is fully committed to supporting the successful launch of the National Games. In addition to sponsoring this exhibition and related activities, the Bank has over 430 volunteers dedicated to offering assistance for the Games in Hong Kong. Just as athletes pursue innovation and breakthroughs in their achievements, BOCHK also upholds the same spirit while striving for high-quality development. Featuring more than 20 interactive exhibits, the exhibition invites visitors to experience the essence and enjoyment of various sports, such as the spin of rugby, the jumps of beach volleyball, the speed of track cycling, the precision of golf, the attacks in fencing, and the defence in basketball. Visitors can also take part in the fitness tests in the "Sports for Wellness" zone to better understand their own physical conditions. In addition, the exhibition covers sports psychology, sports medicine, sports nutrition, etc., facilitating members of the public to understand the concept of sports comprehensively and learn how to integrates sports into everyday life.

The exhibition also presents Hong Kong athletes' medals and equipment, including the track-cycling gear of Ms Lee Wai-sze and the gold medal won by Mr Wu Siu-hong at the IBF World Bowling Championships, which highlight athletes' relentless efforts and pursuit of excellence in the spirit of sportsmanship.

The HKScM will invite athletes to share experience in their personal journeys, and organise a series of educational programmes, including talks, workshops, and scientific demonstrations. There will be free Cantonese guided tours of the exhibition every Saturday and Sunday (with three sessions daily) from 8 November to 22 February 2026.

The exhibition is presented by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department as the second edition of the National Development and Achievements Series. It is organised by the HKScM, and exclusively sponsored by Bank of China (Hong Kong).
